SUBJECT: I. V. THERAPY TECHNICIAN

DIVISION: EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Objective: To establish standards and guidelines for training and certification as an Intravenous Technician in

Baltimore County.

Section 1: Program Requirements

A. Must possess current certification as an Emergency Medical Technician-Basic (EMT-B).

- B. Must have company approval.
- C. Must attend all training sessions.
- D. Must successfully complete the didactic portion (to include a final examination) and demonstrate all applicable psychomotor skills to the instructor.
- E. Must successfully complete the final examination.
- F. Must attain clinical experience and successfully establish ten (10) IV's in clinical setting as determined by the Fire Rescue Academy.
- G. Must receive successful evaluation in a clinical setting.
- H. Must complete all recertification as outlined in Section 3 below.

Section 2: Training

- A. Intravenous Technician is conducted by the Fire Rescue Academy.
- B. Clinical Rotation
 - 1. Students must attend the clinical rotation as assigned by the Fire Rescue Academy.
 - 2. Students are expected to attend all scheduled clinical rotations. If a student is unable to attend a clinical rotation, the students shall contact the Fire Rescue Academy.
 - 3. Rules of conduct and behavior standards while attending clinical rotations shall be those outlined by the Fire Rescue Academy.
 - 4. Students attending clinical rotations shall be attired in either the Class B or Class C uniform. Uniforms shall be worn in conformance with the Baltimore County Fire Department uniform standards. Volunteer personnel shall were the uniform in conformance with their company policy.
 - 5. After successful completion of the clinical experience, the student will receive a functional privileges letter and certification card from the Fire Rescue Academy. A copy of the functional privileges letter shall be sent to the student's Company Commander, or Senior Volunteer Station Officer and EMS District Officer.

Section 3: Certification

- A. Intravenous Technician Certification shall be valid for such a period consistent with the provider's Emergency Medical Technician-Basic (EMT-B) certification.
- B. An Intravenous Technician shall meet the below listed recertification procedures:
 - 1. Successfully complete twenty-four intravenous cannulations within the thirty-six month certification period.
 - a. Intravenous cannulations shall be documented on Form 616.
 - b. Forms 616's shall be forwarded to the Fire Rescue Academy fifteen days prior to EMT-B expiration (June 15th for a June 30th expiration and December 16th for a December 31st expiration).
 - 2. Complete an on-line continuing education program. The program will be available on sixty days prior to EMT-B expiration dates (May 1^{st} for June expirations and November 1^{st} for December expirations).

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- 3. Successfully complete an on-line evaluation based upon the on-line orientation program. This evaluation will be automatically sent to the Fire Rescue Academy after completing the evaluation.
- 4. Intravenous Technicians successfully meeting recertification requirements will be issued new Intravenous Technician cards.
- C. Intravenous Technicians who fail to complete the required number of intravenous cannulations shall be sent to a clinical site in order to achieve ten successful cannulations.

Section 4: Certification Maintenance

A. Personnel hold the ranks of Probationary Emergency Medical Technician (PEMT), Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), and Emergency Medical Technician/Firefighters (EMT/FF) must maintain IV Technician status.

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
